



## **GREEN CARD**

On 11 and 12 September 2025, the Danish parliament had the honour of hosting an interparliamentary conference on the future of agriculture and food in the European Union as part of the parliamentary dimension of the Danish EU presidency. We thank the Commission for contributing to the conference by sending Mr. Gijs Schilthuis, Director for Sustainability, to brief participants on the Commission's ongoing work.

The event brought together parliamentarians from a range of national parliaments in the EU and provided a valuable platform for the exchange of knowledge and perspectives on the future of the EU's agricultural and food sectors. Particular attention was devoted to the potential of plant-based foods and biosolutions in driving the sustainable transition.

On behalf of the Danish Parliament (Folketinget), the Portuguese Parliament (Assembleia da República), the Dutch Senat (Eerste Kamer der Staten-Generaal) and the Dutch House of Representatives (Tweede Kamer der Staten-Generaal) we are pleased to submit herewith a concrete outcome of the conference in the form of a Green Card that calls upon the Commission to present an action plan for plant-based foods.

As highlighted in the Green Card, plant-based foods and biosolutions hold significant potential to transform the EU's food system. Advancing this agenda could open new business opportunities for farmers and the wider
