**Subject: Invitation to a CONT Interparliamentary Committee Meeting on the “Recovery and Resilience Facility (RRF) oversight and the future outlook concerning the next Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF)”, 24 June (pm) 2026 in Brussels**

Dear Colleague,

The Recovery and Resilience Facility (RRF), established in 2021 under NextGenerationEU, alongside the 2021–2027 Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF), has been a key instrument in addressing the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and ensuring economic growth in Europe. National authorities, including parliaments, have played an important role in its oversight, ensuring accountability and transparency by monitoring National Recovery and Resilience Plans (NRRPs), government implementation, and progress against agreed milestones and targets.

At EU level, the Committee on Budgetary Control (CONT) of the European Parliament is a key actor scrutinising the implementation of the EU budget, including the Next Generation EU, and safeguarding the Union’s financial interests. It is also contributing to the upcoming negotiations on the MFF for 2028–2034, providing opinions and, together with the Committee on Budgets (BUDG), leading work on the Budget expenditure tracking and performance framework Regulation.

As the RRF approaches its conclusion and negotiations on the future MFF advance, the CONT Committee would like to invite all national parliaments to exchange views on experiences concerning the monitoring of the RRF, to identify common challenges, share best practices, and discuss how lessons learned can inform stronger accountability, transparency, and effectiveness in the future EU long-term budget.

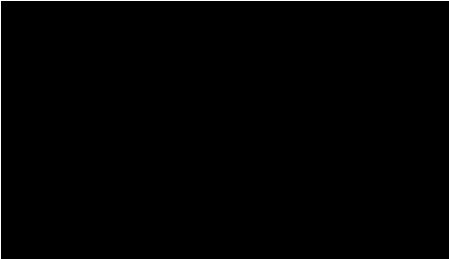
This Interparliamentary Committee Meeting (ICM) will take place on 24 June 2026 from 15:00 to 18:00 (CET) in Brussels and in physical presence only. Before the ICM, a walking networking lunch will be served from 13:30.

As you will see from the enclosed draft programme, we have divided the discussions in two panels and will try to have each of the panels opened with short opening remarks by

colleagues from national parliaments, from the CONT Committee and from the European Court of Auditors and OLAF/EPPO. After the introductory speeches, there will be a joint exchange of views with both MPs and MEPs (with interventions of approximately 2 minutes per member). Following the exchange of views, the initial speakers are invited to give feedback and/or closing remarks.

The CONT Committee is convinced that this event will provide an opportunity to learn from each other, to raise awareness of common challenges and to share ideas and best practices. We sincerely hope that you will be able to accept our invitation, and we are looking forward to welcoming you to the ICM on 24 June 2026.
