The Senate

I.

1. Supports,

in general, both proposals for regulations and considers them as an important contribution to the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and the achievement of the 2030 climate and energy framework targets;

II.

1. Recalls

its Resolution No. 658 of 14th June 2012 on the accounting rules for land use related to climate change, in which the Senate was aware of the importance and potential of soil and forests in respect of absorption of greenhouse gases and carbon fixation both in soils and in biomass growing thereon and in which stressed that conservation of soil quality and its acreage is a condition for effective possibility of carbon fixation in soils;

2. Is therefore of the opinion,

as the Senate mentioned in its Resolution No. 148 of 17th June 2015 on the Report from the Commission to the European Parliament and the Council: Climate action progress report, including the report on the functioning of the European carbon market and the report on the review of Directive 2009/31/EC on the geological storage of carbon dioxide, that the transition towards a low-carbon economy must be brought about by measures based on market mechanisms, cost effectiveness and technological neutrality;

3. Agrees

with the partial objections of the Government of the Czech Republic on both proposals for regulations;

4. Particularly calls for,

- a. a clarification of choosing the outset of allocation trajectory for 2020 and on choosing the reference period 2016-2018 for calculation of allocation in the proposal of the "Effort Sharing Regulation";
- a specification of the calculation mechanism and of the methodology used for determining the maximum volume of LULUCF credits under the effort sharing;
- c. a review of administratively very demanding reporting duties under both proposals for regulations;

5. Considers

A European Strategy for Low-Emission Mobility very important and agrees with the necessity of improvement of relevant regulatory framework while at the same time assesses positively that the European Commission approaches this issue comprehensively;

6. Identifies

with the partial objections of the Government of the Czech Republic mentioned in the Government's position to the Communication; in particular the Senate lacks more detailed information on future direction of this EU policy in order to realistically assess the possible impact of upcoming steps to the car industry, which is a crucial segment of industry in the Czech Republic;

III.

1. Requests

the Government to inform the Senate about the way this Resolution has been taken into account, as well as about further development of negotiations regarding the draft regulations and about further initiatives following the Communication;

2. Authorises

the President of the Senate to forward this Resolution to the European Commission.
